You have chosen to start a method of contraception before your next period starts.

Two things to consider:
1. Using additional contraception  Because your new method will not work straight away, you will need to also use condoms or avoid sex fordays until your new method becomes fully effective.
2. Excluding pregnancy
We recommend you perform a pregnancy test in weeks, on or after
This is because there may be a small risk that you already have an early pregnancy (that is too early to be detected by a pregnancy test today).  Once you have quick-started your new method of contraception your bleeding pattern is not a reliable indicator of pregnancy. If the pregnancy test is positive there is a theoretical risk that your pregnancy could be affected by exposure to the hormones in your contraceptive; however, most evidence indicates no harm.
